held this license in the other state for at least one year, and is in good standing.

<u>Universal Recognition of Occupational Licenses Act:</u> a license shall be issued to an applicant who establishes residence in Mississippi if the applicant holds a current license in good standing from another state, has been licensed by the other state for at least one year and satisfies certain other conditions.
