**Board Composition:** Seven members: Six professional geologists appointed by the Governor and the State Geologist, who is an

ex officio member of the Board, also a professional geologist, appointed by the Governor.

**Requirements:** 

Education: Bachelor's degree in geology (or another four-year academic program) from an institution of higher education

approved by the Board, but with a minimum of 30 semester or 45 quarter hours of geology course work. At least twenty-four (24) of the semester hours or thirty-six (36) of the quarter hours in geology should be in at least five (5) of the following subject areas: economic geology, engineering geology, environmental geology, field geology, geochemistry, geomorphology, geophysics, hydrogeology, mineralogy, paleontology,

petrology, sedimentology, stratigraphy, or structural geology.

Experience: Four years of active professional practice in geologic work of a character satisfactory to the Board; no credit

is given for post-Baccalaureate degrees.

Grandfathering: Ended June 30, 1998.

**Cooperative Licensure - (Comity/Reciprocity):** Can grant comity or reciprocity provided applicant meets the minimum Wyoming educational and experience requirements, and (1) has passed the ASBOG® examination or an examination which the Board has deemed comparable, or (2) held a "grandfather" license in another state for a minimum of five years.

Wyoming has a Memorandum of Understanding with the Wyoming Board of Professional Engineers.
